New York, NY At the New York Housing Conference (NYHC) and National Housing Conference (NHC) 35th Annual Awards Luncheon, mayor Michael Bloomberg was presented with a 10-ft. long scroll depicting the 82,688 affordable housing projects that have been created during his administration so far.

The mayor was the special guest and delivered remarks on the importance of affordable housing before 1,200 of the nation's influential figures in real estate, banking and community development. The event honored those who continue to create and preserve affordable housing in New York and nationwide.
